

Anyone who has been interested in Irish polytheism knows the headaches and heartaches of endless research, which typically result in older more established pagans letting you know that most of your conclusions are inaccurate. Here we have a wonderful beginning and even some clarification of things that can be very difficult to find. I myself have been studying this spirituality for years and found myself learning new and exciting things. Everyone should have a copy of this book if they are even slightly interested in an Irish poly pathway.

As can be seen from the page count (89), this is a very short book, typical for a Pagan Portals book.

Even so, it packs in quite a bit. There are so very few books out there written on Celtic Reconstructionism and Daimler's book on Irish Reconstructionism is a welcome addition. This book is a well-researched look at the basics and should serve as a great introductory text for people interested in walking this path and don't know where to start. The book is made up of 7 chapters and discusses the methodology behind reconstructionism, the basic beliefs of the Irish, rituals, the holy days, and mysticism. Chapter six deals with controversial topics like race, cultural appropriation and sexuality. In the final chapter, the author wraps up the book with a conclusion. I really enjoyed reading this book, twice. It has just the right amount of information as to not leave people wanting or confused but also just the right amount of push to get you on your own exploration of this path. Highly recommended for people who have read the Celtic FAQ, have decided that Ireland will be their hearth culture and are ready to get the specific basics for that hearth culture.
