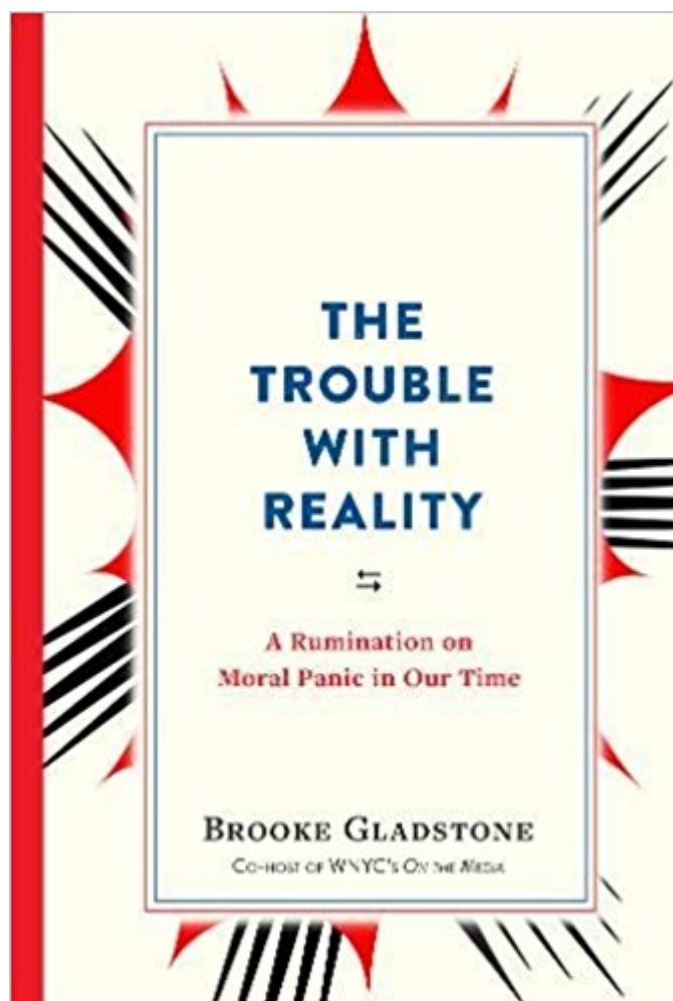

The Trouble With Reality: A Ruminations On Moral Panic In Our Time

Every week on the public radio show *On the Media*, the award-winning journalist Brooke Gladstone analyzes the media and how it shapes our perceptions of the world. This slim volume reads like an extended monologue on *On the Media*, which is pretty much what I was hoping for when I bought it. Brooke’s insightful observations give careful weight to a number of the different perspectives that led us to now without being condescending towards either side, while recognizing that her perspectives all come from her own understanding of reality. I tune in to *On the Media* every week precisely for Bob & Brooke’s unique blend of cynicism, analysis, and, oddly enough, hope. I will absolutely be getting this for friends and relatives.

This thought-provoking essay takes on the battle between discourse and disarray in the war between rationality and passion. It won’t make you feel better about the weaponization of communications, but it will relieve you of some of your blissful ignorance.

I love Brooke Gladstone on *On The Media* podcast and always thought that she had sober opinions and was able to take a birds eye view of our turbulent current events. Her book offered the same historical perspective that I expect from her and I loved delving deeper into her view point. Although sometimes frightening, her book provided much needed context about how our obsession with pop culture, social media, and reality tv has been turned back on us like a carnival mirror.
