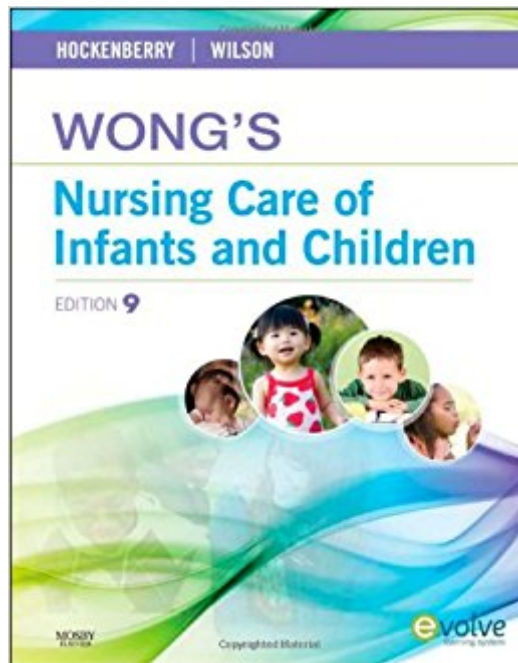


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Wong's Nursing Care Of Infants And Children, 9th Edition

First let me say that if you are in a nursing program that uses this textbook, I realize you don't have a choice in the matter and as such, book reviews are of limited utility. That said, I have to be honest and say that this text book is simply horrible. I survived my pediatric nursing course and got a good grade, but it was in spite of this torturous textbook, which I am pleased to now be able to say I will never have to look at again. Yes, the textbook contains a tremendous wealth of accurate, raw information. But that's the problem also. It's RAW. The organization of the text is terrible, finding the relevant critical info you actually need is nearly impossible, and it is pure torture to try to read. The authors do not appear to understand the concepts of summarization, highlighting, and organization. Virtually every page is a monolithic wall of seemingly randomized, excessively verbose, dry text. If you have to use this textbook, try to get as much as you can out of your lectures and whatever other learning materials are offered by your professors, because this text is mostly useless.

Way way way too wordy. As a nursing student, I definitely didn't have time to complete the readings because every chapter took about 10 hours to read. When you are assigned 3-4 chapters a week, that means studying for 30 hours for one class and that just doesn't work in nursing school.

Needed this book for my BSN program. Not that I would choose a giant text to purchase for any other reason than professionally, but this does happen to be a great book. The subjects are

presented very logically with thorough explanations and nursing alerts throughout the material. Those are important topics, pretty much the most essential things to remember about that topic - whether it be regarding a pediatric medication or vital assessment in relation to the patient's progress. Those alerts and the charts in the book nicely summarize a lot of important info that our professors mention will be on the NCLEX and also on our unit exams. Definitely a nicely done textbook, although if you're getting this I realize it may not be a personal choice. The book arrived in essentially new condition, but the only complaint is that the binding was kind of separated partially/messed up. The book functions, it's not falling apart or anything, and I selected a used rental, so that was my choice.
