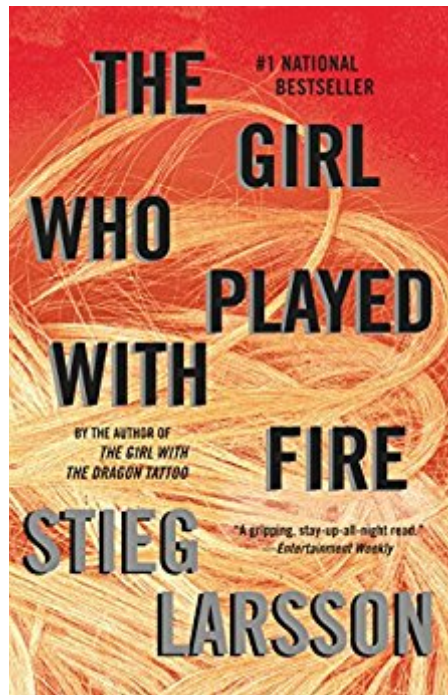




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The Girl Who Played With Fire (Millennium Series Book 2)



Synopsis

On the eve of its publication, the two reporters responsible for the article are murdered, and the fingerprints found on the murder weapon belong to his friend, the troubled genius hacker Lisbeth Salander. Blomkvist, convinced of Salander's innocence, plunges into an investigation. Meanwhile, Salander herself is drawn into a murderous game of cat and mouse, which forces her to face her dark past.

I had wanted to read the Girl with the Dragon Tattoo for a year or so and I finally decided to give it a shot. It was definitely nothing like any other book I had read and I was literally mentally exhausted after reading the first few chapters, but I got through it and once the story picked up I fell in love with all of the characters and couldn't get enough. I was addicted to reading these books once I started them because I loved how they made me think/feel, how they made me sit at the edge of my seat at times, and how I would literally get goosebumps from some of the situations or dialogue. Stieg Larsson was truly a master at writing because the way the journey plays out once you get to the Girl Who Kicked the Hornet's Nest you feel a true kinship and sense of responsibility for Lisbeth Salander and when she finally got her time in the courtroom it actually brought tears to my eyes because it was just so awesome. I don't want to give anything away if you haven't read these books yet so that's why my review is a bit too cryptic. Bottom line is: if you love crime, suspense, romance, or mystery novels, these books are all of those things rolled up in one. Just read these books, you won't regret it.

The final episode in the trilogy finds Lisbeth recovering from near-fatal gunshot wounds, and approaching her trial. A guilty verdict would result in long-term commitment. The secret group within

the Swedish Intelligence Agency is working hard to ensure that Lisbeth will have no credibility in court. Mikael Blomkvist is working to try and uncover their activities and actions. While this is hardly great literature, this book fulfilled all my desires for thrill and suspense. It moves at lightening speed, with a large and complicated cast of characters. As was the case with the first book, I found the journalism sub-plots to be much less interesting than the story of Lisbeth and the Section. Erika Berger's troubles at SMP struck me as an unnecessary side-note. Still, I read all 500+ pages in a single weekend. It couldn't wait to find out what happens, and I'm sorry that there won't be any more.

Merely the first half of a story w/o any resolution -- the 3rd book, "Who Kicked the Hornet's Nest," is actually the 2nd half of the story, which is indeed satisfactorily completed and finished by the end. Continuing the characters from *With The Dragon Tattoo* into an even more gripping narrative, and more complicated storyline. Where the 1st book contained an assignment for both Salander and Blomkvist and they completed that assignment, and the story was complete, the 2nd book, *Who Played With Fire*, is just the first half of a long must-read tale. So be warned -- if you start this book and find (like I did) that you can't put it down, you'll get to the end only to discover that you are in the middle of the crisis and nothing has been resolved. So make sure you have the 3rd book handy so you can continue reading the sentence (so to speak). Some have mentioned that the exposition which frustrated them by its quantity in the first book is a bit less. I guess I've learned I don't need to read every word of every description of every place or character in order to follow the plot/characters and maintain my excitement/interest. I had no trouble, but then, I had no trouble w/*Dragon Tattoo*, either. Looking forward to reading *Spider's Web*, hoping it measures up. I (like so many others) need more Lisbeth Salander.

Book 1 was excellent and the author has created a sequel worthy of respect in its own right. If you enjoy perplexing mysteries that make you feel like you know all the facts known to the protagonist and are still surprised by the turn of events, this book is a must read! You will not be disappointed. Enjoy. On to book 3.
