

First off, I want to say this is a great read. Really unique idea and characters. I found myself rooting for the main characters 100% and read all four books in less than 3 days because I didn't want to put them down. Based on the story alone I'd give this book 4.5 stars. I took off one star because of

the arbitrary separation of this story into 4 books. Aside from book #1, the books do not stand alone, so publishing them separately is a bit mean. If you want to read one book, be prepared to buy all 4. The second star was taken off due to the half-hearted editing job. I am a self-proclaimed grammar nazi, but this book had typos on at least 50% of the pages. All in all, if you are prepared to buy all 4 books right away (and immune to spelling mistakes) I definitely recommend this book as a captivating and heart-warming read.

A good second book in the series, plotline continues on with a logical pattern and the characters continue to be developed in more detail. The various races and religions are very well detailed and have obviously been carefully designed. Dropped one star rating as this is definitely not a stand alone, which the first book could conceivably be. This is very close to a cliffhanger, which I hate but in this particular case the series is complete so will continue.

This 2nd book is as brilliant as the 1st. Fascinated with all the characters' depth and range. The plot is strong and well rounded.

Ru is a very awesome character that doesn't like to follow the directions of others unless he is ordered. I never liked the girl to me she was a little too sympathetic and not everyone out there is that sympathetic.

Though I dislike Saturday matinee serial installments in general, I'm still buying because the characters are both dimensional and nicely drawn to develop the interesting storyline. My only other "concern" is with my growing suspicion that English is not the author's first language or else his education is sadly deficient in the rules of grammar. I also suspect in his rush to publish his next installment he is not using outside editorial proof reading. There are just too many weird tense choices made over and over: like "span" instead of "spun" and odd prepositions double typed or completely inappropriate for the sentence. In the first installment this was a slightly disconcerting curiosity but in its continued obvious presence as a writing pattern it is beginning to strike me as a distinct lack of craftsmanship beneath the level of storytelling potential in this author's talents. He really needs a second reader proofing for him so he could begin to become sensitive to the issue and learn to correct the distraction it creates. This story is too good to be so slipshod in creating his manuscripts!

I decided to take a chance on this book even though the first in the series had absolutely terrible editing, or a lack thereof anyway. Unfortunately, this followed suit with multiple mistakes throughout. The formatting was rather frustrating as well, with the font size switching between large and small from paragraph to paragraph for seemingly no reason. All that aside, I thoroughly enjoyed the story. It is evident that much time has been spent crafting the various races, religions, and magical workings in this strange world. The characters are well defined with varying personalities and abilities to create believable and interesting interactions. As much as I do want to see the path the story will take, the sloppiness in which the first two installments were published will give me pause before purchasing any more.

I like fresh stories with interesting ideas. A little rough but well written. Too short, more of a novella than a novel.

I have been a fan of Descendants for years. I returned after taking some time off, and found he had ebooks, and this series. He still needs an editor, but the books are still a fun read. I like the tone difference in Rune Breaker, and it is a good fantasy series so far. Lets see where he takes it.
