

This is a decent textbook. They offer a lot of quantified data to back up their arguments, well thought approaches and explanations of theories that embody environmental sociology. Written in the style of an advocate rather than an educator, the main lesson of this book is that Environmental sociology is not a science at all but a cover for a political agenda. Do not read this or

take a course that uses it as a text thinking that you are going to learn about the the way society and the environment influence each other. It is no about how to think but rather about what he authors believe you should think. It is more about learning the doctrines of their political outlook than anything scientific. If you would like to read quotes by Saul Alinsky and Al Gore, neither of them a sociologist or an environmental scientist, and the political opinions of the authors then this is for you.
