

The Third Reconstruction: How A Moral Movement Is Overcoming The Politics Of Division And Fear



Synopsis

A modern-day civil rights champion tells the stirring story of how he helped start a movement to bridge America's racial divide. Over the summer of 2013, the Reverend Dr. William J. Barber II led more than a hundred thousand people at rallies across North Carolina to protest restrictions to voting access and an extreme makeover of state government. These protests, "the largest state government-focused civil disobedience campaign in American history," came to be known as Moral Mondays and have since blossomed in states as diverse as Florida, Tennessee, Wisconsin, Ohio, and New York. At a time when divide-and-conquer politics are exacerbating racial strife and economic inequality, Rev. Barber offers an impassioned, historically grounded argument that Moral Mondays are hard evidence of an embryonic Third Reconstruction in America. The first Reconstruction briefly flourished after Emancipation, and the second Reconstruction ushered in meaningful progress in the civil rights era. But both were met by ferocious reactionary measures that severely curtailed, and in many cases rolled back, racial and economic progress. This Third Reconstruction is a profoundly moral awakening of justice-loving people united in a fusion coalition powerful enough to reclaim the possibility of democracy, "even in the face of corporate-financed extremism. In this memoir of how Rev. Barber and allies as diverse as progressive Christians, union members, and immigration-rights activists came together to build a coalition, he offers a trenchant analysis of race-based inequality and a hopeful message for a nation grappling with persistent racial and economic injustice. Rev. Barber writes movingly and pragmatically about how he laid the groundwork for a state-by-state movement that unites black, white, and brown, rich and poor, employed and unemployed, gay and straight, documented and undocumented, religious and secular. Only such a diverse fusion movement, Rev. Barber argues, can heal our nation's wounds and produce public policy that is morally defensible, constitutionally consistent, and economically sane. The Third Reconstruction is both a blueprint for movement building and an inspiring call to action from the twenty-first century's most effective grassroots organizer.

This book by Rev. Dr. William J. Barber describes the movement he helped to launch that aims to revive the efforts of the post-Civil War Reconstruction and the Second Reconstruction that coincided with Civil Rights movement of the mid-20th century. Each of these movements involved active cooperation of blacks and non-elite whites on issues of justice of interest to all the cooperating groups. Each of them were largely reversed by a concerted effort that sought to reclaim the elites' former privileges under new descriptions. Rev. Barber, who grounds his approach in the prophetic books of the Bible and an astute analysis of the divisive strategy behind the New Jim Crow, advocates a fusion politics that aims to unite those working for civil rights, those working for workers

rights, debtors rights, rights of sexual minorities, and environmental justice. This book describes months of work in the Moral Mondays movement in North Carolina, which involved nonviolent mass demonstrations at the state capital, and the extension of the movement to other states in the South and, more recently, to states outside the South. This vision and the practice that goes with it cuts across familiar divisions of left and right, liberal and conservative, male and female, Christian and non-Christian, theist and atheist, native citizen and recent immigrant. As one who has felt alienated from what often passes for Christianity in the United States, I welcome this book and the inclusive yet ultimately Biblical way of thinking and working for justice that it grows out of and aims to extend.

Outstanding. Reverend Barber has a gift for seeing the commonalities that bind us all together. He beautifully articulates the reasons that the moral many need to come together to overcome the ruthless few. He cuts across all the divisive issues of race, class, sexual orientation, gender and politics to raise up the call for a true fusion movement in America focused on not left versus right, or right versus left; but on right versus wrong. This book offers a brilliant blueprint for how to overcome the ruthless few that oppress the moral many.

Barber describes not just the story of faith-based organizing in NC, uniting all the issues in a 'fusion' coalition, but shares the largely untold story of past fusion movements in our history. I had not known of the extent and depth of Black and White working together in the south after the Civil War. Nor of the devastating effect of backlash from the southern power structure. He shares a powerful, hopeful perspective that is also a road map for us in other states, working together, across issues, to recognize how much we need each other if we are to protect the gains in civil rights from the last 80 years. He emphasizes a story of relationship, where people are challenged and provided the structure to see each other's humanity, which motivates us to care for each other and take action. I wish every American could know this story - our past and our future.

Rev. Barber's views and actions are inspiring. I agree with his view that our nation is in the third reconstruction of our government. We are a nation, supposedly, devoted to the concept of inalienable rights, such as life and liberty and the pursuit of happiness, of equality and justice for all. However, we have compromised these ideals for the sake of prosperity (or greed) on numerous occasions, starting with the Three-Fifths Compromise that allowed plantation owners to continue to profit and politically use slavery. Then again, we compromised with the same forces to finally end the bloody conflict of our Civil War in the late 1800s, and again with the same forces after the Voting Rights Act of 1965. Now the sharp divides among our citizens reflects the tension between two views of freedom, which Abraham Lincoln described as Freedom meaning one thing to the sheep and another to the wolf. Rev. Barber is firmly siding with the flock but has some suggestions for how the sheep can stand up to the wolf. The book is very engaging and presents of a hopeful future, if we are willing to work for it.
