Born February 2, 1905, Ayn Rand published her first novel, *We the Living*, in 1936. *Anthem* followed in 1938. It was with the publication of *The Fountainhead* (1943) and *Atlas Shrugged* (1957) that she achieved her spectacular success. Rand's unique philosophy, Objectivism, has gained a worldwide audience. The fundamentals of her philosophy are put forth in three nonfiction books, *Introduction to Objectivist Epistemology*, *The Virtues of Selfishness*, and *Capitalism: The Unknown Ideal*. They are all available in Signet editions, as is the magnificent statement of her artistic credo, *The Romantic Manifesto*.

This is a fabulous collection of philosophical exerts from Ayn Rand's three famous works. It contains key philosophical passages from WE THE LIVING, FOUNTAINHEAD and ATLAS SHRUGGED. It is a "manifesto" to use her words, that outlines her later Objectivist writings. Thrilling to read, it felt like Ayn Rand was speaking directly to me in private. Perfectly lovely...

This is the first book to read when exploring Ayn Rand. I never read Atlas Shrugged or The Fountainhead because I don't live the romance part but this book has the most important speeches in both books. To the haters of Ayn Rand: try reading this book instead of hater her because you think you hate her. Nothing is worse than a prejudice dolt.

A great book to introduce or develop Ayn's ideas. It features an overview intro essay along with passages from her fiction. All of it's forceful - as is typical of Ayn - raising issues that have a key bearing on our lives both as individuals and in society. It does contain some of the biting language that's an element of caricatures of her, but her ideas go beyond this. She's accessible, clear, powerful and as relevant today as when this book first came out in the 1960s.

The title essay is a must read for any individual who understands, supports, and desires to spread the word about Objectivism. The remainder of the book are key excerpts from all of Rand's fictional novels that outline some key ideas or specific takes on vital concepts that she writes on in her fiction.
