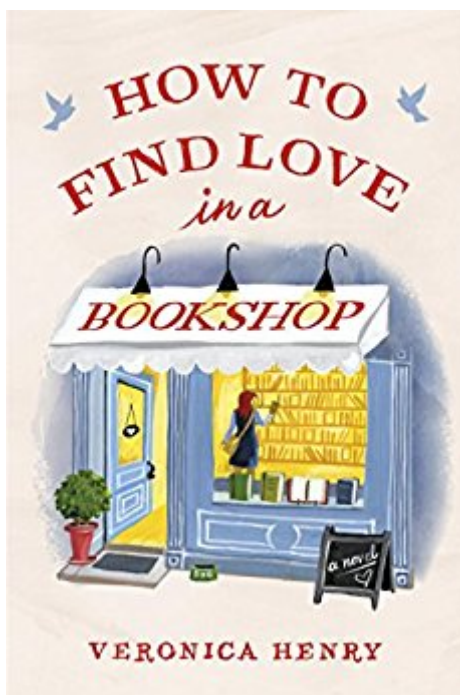

"How to Find Love in a Bookshop" is one of my new favorite books! There has been a void in this type of writing since the death of much beloved Maeve Binchy in 2012. Victoria Henry has filled that void, much to my delight, with this beautifully written, delightful, novel, so filled with heart! There is a large "cast" of characters, all who come in and out of the life of a bookseller and her shop, which had been her father's, until his death too soon in life. The novel is set in a small town in England. Everyone is flawed, but lovable in some way, except for Hugh. (You will see why if you read this gift

of a book.) I love bookstores (or "bookshops" as they are called in England), so setting a novel in one makes the story extra special for me. Across the generations, the town folk come together, helping a daughter grieve for her father, and becoming part of her life. There will be a wedding, music, cooking, a possible new love for several characters, and changes in the lives of all the characters. This is a difficult book to put down. When I finished, I held it in my hands for a long time, knowing I had to give it back to the library today, but feeling so happy that it had been mine for the few days I spent reading it.

How to Find Love in a Bookshop is a new release from Penguin Group, and I was excited to receive an advance reader copy from them in exchange for an honest review. The title of this book was enough to get me intrigued. I love books about books and this one sounded like a sweet read with a romantic twist, and I really, really wanted to love this book. But unfortunately, it fell short for me. Let me start by saying that the writing was solid. The descriptions of the bookshop and the loft upstairs that Julius and Emilia called home for years made me want to disappear inside the book. The author's love and appreciation of books resonates through the pages. I think for me it was mostly a lack of being able to really get into the story. While the descriptions were vivid, I found myself unable to latch onto the main character, Emilia. I think this was because there were so many minor characters and every time I thought we would really explore Emilia's story, the book either broke off into another character's story or it flashed back to Julius's story in the past. It was difficult to keep them all straight. Halfway through the book, new minor characters were still being introduced. For me, all characters should be introduced and developed to the point of remembrance once I'm halfway through a book. Unfortunately, that just didn't happen for me here. If you enjoy books about books, bookshops, people's lives intersecting, and love stories, then you should pick up How to Find Love in a Bookshop and give it a try. There are so many couples in this novel it would seem impossible to keep their stories separate but author Henry does so deftly, at the same time weaving each situation into one delightful romance where the happy endings are a sure thing. Even the story of Julius's courtship of Rebecca, played out in

flashback in beautifully sensual terms, renders their love part of the magic in which the bookshop and Julius Å Å Å™ later life is steeped. At Nightingale Books, each customer finds the story he needs and the encouragement to make his own story come true. This novel is one the reader will finish with a sigh, and then set his sights on the nearest bookshop in hopes of finding his own happily ever after. Peasebrook is the place where Å Å Åœeverybody knows your name, Å Å Å• your business, and its bookshop is where they all congregate to share their dreams.
