

This work explores the literary, historical and primarily theological thought that came into being in post-war America in response to the Shoah. It makes in depth exploration of the work of a number of thinkers : Eliezer Berkovits, Irving ( Yitz)Greenberg, Emil Fackenheim, Richard Rubinstein. It also considers the writing of Elie Wiesel, Hannah Arendt on the Shoah. This is so far as I know the most significant work on this subject. It is a work which in my opinion has answers which are themselves questions, about a subject which will always be bound up for any thinking person, and especially

any Jew with tremendous pain and questioning. Michael Morgan has done an outstanding job in editing and introducing the work. I do have one objection.
