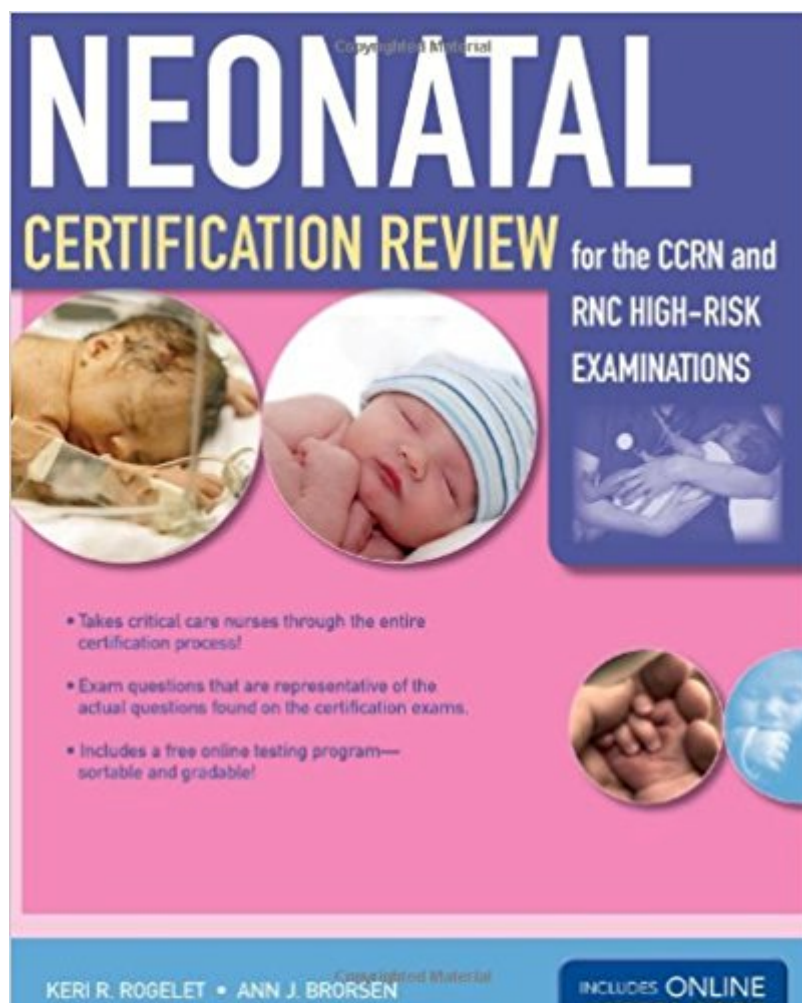

The book is essentially a set of test questions written in the same format as the exam. It is helpful in that the explanations for the correct answers are detailed. However, if you're looking for an instructional book, this isn't it. It's pretty expensive for what it is. A lot of the other competitor books offer online tests with their instructional book, so I would go with one of them instead.

Don't trust this book! There were numerous questions and answers in this book that gave me pause,

but this one clearly demonstrates the out-datedness of this text:Pg 155. (in answer to question 128 "When managing a patient with persistent pulmonary hypertension, the pH should be maintained at ____ while the PaCO₂ should be between ____.") And the "answer" is...."When managing a patient with persistent pulmonary hypertension, the pH should be maintained between 7.45 and 7.6, while the PaCO₂ should be between 20 and 30."I know the copyright says 2011, but this answer is straight out of some long-ago decade. I just put the book down and never cracked it again. Total waste of \$80.

I bought many other study systems and this was by far the best tool that prepared me for successfully passing the NCC RNC-NIC exam. The online practice test that you can customize to be the exact same format as the real exam. There is rationale for the questions and the question base is huge. Dont waste your time and money with any other study guide/system.

After taking the rnc I have to say this book is not enough. You need to read a curriculum core book through. The rnc test questions are much more difficult than these questions presented in the book. If I could tell anyone something to help them to pass it would be to read read read the core patho and systems to help them.

Definitely the best review if you plan on taking RNC. Note that all questions in the book are in RNC format which has 3 multiple choice answers. (CCRN has 4 answers, and questions are phrased differently. In my humble opinion CCRN stems can be sometimes more difficult to understand.)The online study guide that comes with the book is great. As someone else mentioned you can generate exams in whichever way you want. The online study guide has systems exams (which can be combined) and 2 final exams (one RNC, the other CCRN) that I think may not be combined and are timed... Even though the book states that it prepares you for both RNC and CCRN, 99% of its focus is on RNC.Overall I really liked the book. The rationales in the back of the book are well-written. Also if you choose a wrong answer during online practice, you get immediate feedback.Since I planned on taking CCRN, I went ahead and answered questions from the Core Curriculum as well, just to cover all fronts and to get used to the question format.

I love it. It is very detailed and gives a concise explanation in the back of the book. I definitely realized my weak areas. I have not taken the exam yet, however I feel as though this book will definitely prepare me for the exam.
