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Awaken Online: Precipice

I was left quite unsettled and nearly cried when I realized I'd reached the end...I finished this book late in the night. When waking this morning, I immediately recalled a dream of me chasing Travis Bagwell with a stick begging for book 3. No seriously, a fantastic second addition to the AO series. Bagwell demonstrates, yet again, the ability to dive into complex topics, emotions, and provide for

stimulating debates on the concepts of good vs evil, ends justifying the means, and sacrifice for the greater need, to name just a few, all in a very non-traditional manner. AO: Precipice is a great read, and would highly recommend it. I would argue it is for a more mature audience simply because of the level of gore and the darker nature of the book, but I would highlight that my opinion does not hold the context of many reads along the same darker vein as this series. Again, highlighting Travis Bagwell's talent to appeal to a broader audience than one might traditional consider for such a read. Bagwell and his work are great examples of not only adding fairly unique works to the genre that provide for stimulating debate, but also works that appeal to a greater readership and broader audience. To provide a landmark work to the genre is worth celebrating, but to do so while at the same time growing the readership base and providing a great depth to his work, is quite a remarkable feat. The growth of each character during this story is well done, and gives an insight to how the mind of someone, who is always at the bottom of the barrel that is life, works. I look forward to the next book in the series. And personally, I hope the story takes more then the 3 books that the author initially intended.

Josh here...and man it feels like it has been so long since I listened to the first entry in this series. Of course, I had to come back and listen to the next entry in this fantastic LitRPG collection. Travis really has a great series going here and I was drawn right in to where we left off in the first book. While it felt like the story may have taken a bit to get going for me, it picked up and kept me going after the first few chapters. The ending definitely left me hanging and now, to quote the narrator in Starship Troopers, "I would like to know more". Many things stood out to me in this series in terms of great character development. Riley's experiences with Alex frustrated me as I've seen similar situations occur far too often. Watching those with power use and abuse those without always frustrates me, so I was easily upset during the interactions between these two. Watching the politics between the game creators and the CPSC, the game creators and their own staff, and the game creators and Jason/Alex was interesting as well. I can say that I easily side with Robert in most cases as, after all, it is just a game. While there are various moral situations

brought up in the game, that is exactly how I looked at each of them, just a scenario in the game. It is when these situations start translating to real life that the real issues start to arise. It will be interesting to see how Alfred interacts with Jason, given the ending to the book. I also found myself sympathizing with Frank and the nature of his character. Most game players use these types of games to escape real life and I could feel Frank's frustration as he went into game play and experienced problems similar to those he would in real life. Watching Jason's skills shift after he was able to overcome his arrogance during his first death was awesome. The venom spitters and bone monsters he crafted, and Travis's descriptions of each, left me with a very vivid mental picture of each. Likewise, watching the battles ensue between Jason, Frank, Riley, and Jason's creations, to include with the game master, were some of the best PvP fight scenes in any LitRPG book I've listened to. This was a great book and while I don't like cliff hangers, I am anxiously awaiting book three. David did a great job with narration and delineation of each character. While this is the only series which I have listened to with his narration, I will definitely be on the lookout for others.

I liked the first book, however this newest book stole the prize and I hope the next is better still. The character growth both emotionally and figuratively was great in Precipice. It got like with Alfred acting as a pseudo conscience as well as some pointed comment from the Old Man. It seems Alex is still a work in progress but I can't wait to see how his and Jason's story develops. I'd like to see how the Original Sin develops along side or separately from the Twilight Throne as the story moves forward. I did like the control room and media perspectives as a third party view of Jason's actions/motives as well. Five stars for sure!!

I've been excited for this sequel since reading the first book. It lives up to the first one. Jason is learning and growing as a character and person. Same as Riley and Frank. Alex's backstory seems a bit cliché, but unlike a lot of these books, his point of view was enjoyable. People make rational, if morally questionable decisions even more so than just Jason. Excited for more!

This book is a great addition to what was started with the original Awaken Online. While there weren't necessarily as many large scale events taking place, the action and tension that occur are spot on. We get to see Jason evolve a bit as a character, and the characters of Riley and Frank get some time too (though not as much as I'd have liked). Overall I thought this was a solid second installment. The ending itself was brutally climactic, and I cannot wait to see where the story goes

from here.

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
