I'll be honest - I'm still not the biggest fan of this series's main character, Brat...er...Brett Masters.

He's lazy, obnoxious, makes bad jokes, and generally goes out of his way to annoy everybody around him so he can avoid his responsibilities and go back to what he loves most: taking naps, playing with his band, and getting drunk or high. Does that mean I don't like the book? Absolutely not. The Big-Ass Witch is a fun, breezy read with a great story and wonderful supporting characters like Lakesha (the titular "big-ass witch") who's given the unenviable task of trying to whip Brett into line; Demetrius, the sweet, sad child ghost; Michael, Brett's much more mature vampire bandmate; Sabrina, Brett's smart, competent, effective mage cousin who matches him snark for snark, and the rest of the crazy cast. I know there's at least one more book coming in this series, and part of what keeps me reading (aside from the enjoyable, fast-paced stories) is the glimmerings that Brett is actually making forward progress toward moving out of slackerhood. I actually hope he doesn't move completely out, though--I think an easygoing, slacker mage (albeit one who actually knows what he's doing and actually makes an effort occasionally) is a nice addition to the normal cast of grim, trenchcoat-clad guys you normally find in urban-fantasy series. Can't wait for the next one!

I adore these books! They entertain me and I find myself laughing out loud at the mess that is Brett. He is the ultimate slacker, but down deep, he has a heart and does care about a few things besides girls, music and naps. Brett seems to think that powerful wizard and slacker are mutually exclusive, but I think that Brett could pull it off. I felt sorry for Brett at the end of the book with the revelation about the Sinclair fight. Brett's relationship with his father is messed up, and I am always amazed at how little Brett's father seems to think of him. Maybe it's just tough love, and sometimes Brett is tough to love. I loved the "Gene, Gene, the dancing machine!" reference. I'm anxious for the next book in the series and I want many more. I hope that Brett will embrace his magic and realize at least some of his potential as a wizard. With his smart mouth, he's a force to be reckoned with, even without the magic.

This new installment of Gary Jonas' new Half-assed Wizard series is a huge page turner and super fast paced read. I easily got sucked into Brett Master's crazy life of indulgence and crazy life events that are supposed to be little tests of his magic that turn into much more. I love how I didn't want to put the story down and found myself drawn to it and was disappointed when this part of the story was over. The story is wonderfully written and kept me mystified as to how someone so laced with sarcasm could make me so fascinated by the way they handle themselves with their screwed up priorities and how the main character unwittingly grows through these experiences. The real question is: can you like a series where the main character is obnoxious, self-indulgent, amazingly lazy, thoughtless, and generally an absolutely perfect example of "slacker"?Apparently you can.I've grown to be fascinated by Brett Masters, at the same time that I despise him, and would kick him out of my house if he existed in real life. But somehow I can't put him and his story down. Two books in now, and while Masters shows only the slightest and most flickering hints of maturity, I find myself absorbed in the character. Some of my fascination is due to the writing, which is quite good for such a light and frothy tale, and some is related to the humor, which can be silly, juvenile, and groan-inducing, but which is marvelously entertaining. Still four stars, but only because I have trouble giving five stars to a character that I want to beat up in a dark alley.For the record, I received a free advance copy of this book in exchange for an honest review.
