Enthralling read. Wheeler is constantly keeping the reader guessing as to the motives and loyalties

of his characters. He has thrown in enough plot twists to keep us distrustful. He has gathered a broad spectrum of characters by this second book but manages to keep us caring for each. There is plenty of action to propel the story forward but these books are more based in philosophy and reason. I enjoy the challenge of solving the puzzle with the pieces he gives the characters and hope to arrive at the correct conclusion before they do! I especially like the subtle relationship developments between the characters. The only one that seems a little unrealistic is the relationship between Phae and her father. I don't know what it would be like to meet a father after 16 years but I imagine she would have strong and conflicting emotions. Wheeler does address it but not in depth. However, it doesn't distract from the story, on the contrary, a think dwelling on it would weigh the story down. He focuses where the focus needs to be, with furthering the complicated plot, revealing slowly the pieces of information needed to unravel the mystery around the arch-Rike Wheeler also manages to skillfully insert gems of wisdom without sounding preachy. I enjoyed his vast collection of clever sayings used by the Romani. It's hard to keep track of all his different cultures but they are reasonably well fleshed out. Some of his cultures respect life, others knowledge. He weaves a complicated example of the interconnectedness of nations and economies. This is a great series. I highly recommend it.
