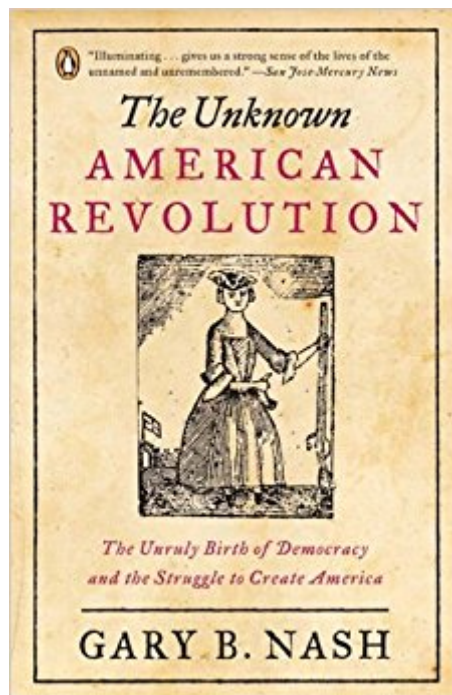




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The Unknown American Revolution: The Unruly Birth Of Democracy And The Struggle To Create America
