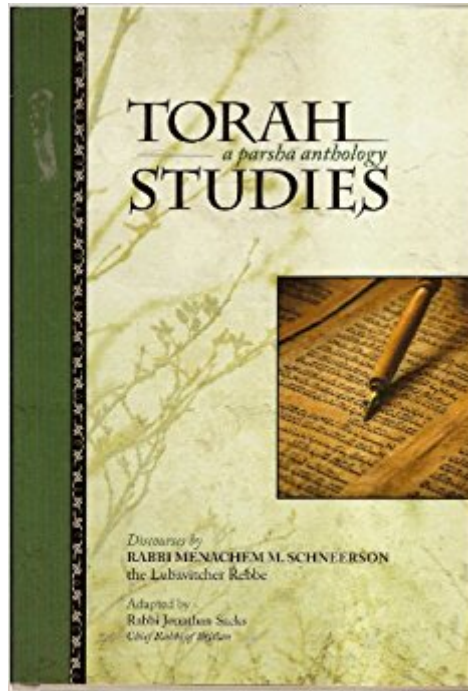

Synopsis
