

Synopsis

Isaac Asimov's death on April 6, 1992, was a great loss to the world of literary science and freethought. The prolific author's vision is unmatched today, and his pointed honesty shines through in *The Roving Mind*, now reissued in this special tribute edition. This collection of essays is wide-ranging, reflecting Asimov's extraordinary skill in disseminating knowledge from across the spectrum of human thought. Some of the areas explored in this volume of 62 essays include creationism, pseudoscience, censorship, population, philosophy of science, transportation, computers and corporations of the future, and astronomy. His predictions about cloning which has only recently become the topic of public debate the theory of "technophobia," and other scientific developments are astounding. Asimov demonstrates his extraordinary skill at disseminating knowledge from across the scientific disciplines as his "roving mind" ranges from the polemical to the persuasive, from the speculative to the realistic. The sixty-two essays in this volume include such subjects as creationism, the distinction between real science and pseudoscience, censorship, the population explosion, technophobia, the social consequences of technological progress, cloning, the possibility of contacting extraterrestrial life, and the wonders of the cosmos. There are also thoughts on his style of writing, stories about his personal life, and recollections of family history--all written in the clear and elegant prose for which Asimov was noted.

I am willing to read just about anything Asimov wrote. And this collection of essays was a pleasure to read. My favorite is the one about Asimov's attempt to learn to use a word processor. There are a few essays about what the world will be like in the year 2000. He uses the word "hologram" a little too much, but he comes really close to predicting a world where something like the internet exists. Really close, but not quite.

Top marks for The Roving Mind. This is a collection of essays on current Science Thought. Asimov is the man who said: "The true delight is in finding out rather than in the knowing." Well, finding out from Issac Asimov is really, really delightful. His writing style is funny, thought-provoking & enlightening, w. loads of inspiration. Religious folks will probably turn away from such writing/thoughts as terrible heresies. So they will lose out on this gem. But i wish that i had this yet to read.

As a long-time Asimov robot science fiction fan, I was extremely pleased to find this collection of brief essays on important science topics -- such as creationism versus evolution, the completely unnecessary tension between the pure and applied sciences, the importance of science education for creating an informed electorate -- that had been published years ago in a wide variety of publications to which I had not subscribed. If you concerned about the decline in the teaching of science by teachers trained in the subject or about the proliferation of programs on cable TV that treat pseudo-scientific claims as if they were valid scientific topics or if you just want to read spritely and engaging prose on science subjects that are still current today, you could not select a better book.
