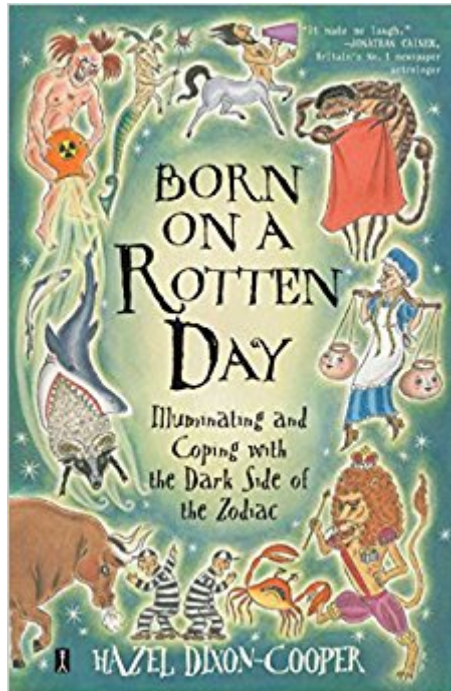


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Born On A Rotten Day

Although the harsh reality of our dark sides according to Hazel may sting a bit, you may also find--as I was happy to find--some triumph in realizing that you've managed to shrink a bit of that darkness down to a tendency rather than a controlling force.
