A decent litrpg story that is just barely gets started when the end arrives. the first book is just too short to really enjoy. Having said that there is potential in the story and characters. Some of them are a bit too clichÃ© at times but I will probably pick up the next book and give the author one more shot.

The story is a bit simple over-the-top fantasy gaming (cliche with a twist or two) and relatively flat characters with hints of something more. Mind you, the hints are about the world out of the game, and remarkably little time is spent on said world. Feels like a missed chance. I enjoyed it, but it is certainly not for everybody.
