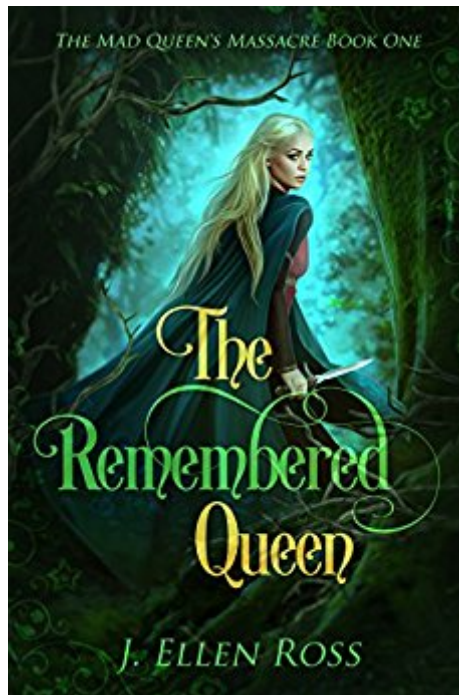




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The Remembered Queen (The Mad Queen's Massacre Book 1)

I read the author's first series, "The Tahaeron Chronicles" and loved all three of the books. I told the author, and she was kind enough to send me her newest book for an honest review. I loved this book just as much. Ms. Ross is a master at world building and character development. Her description of locations gave me the sense that I was there, but she was not overly wordy. The characters were true to life. Jon, Aviana, and their friends became real people. Aviana's fear and self loathing at what she had done made her somewhat sympathetic in the beginning, and even

more so by the end of the book. Jon's strange compulsion to help her was odd to me but became more apparent as the book went on. I don't want to give any of the plot away because you should discover it for yourself. I do want to say that the characters are still with me even after finishing the book. I can't wait to see what's next for Aviana and Jon.

I received a free copy of this book and am voluntarily leaving an honest review. *The Remembered Queen* by J. Ellen Ross is the first book in a new epic fantasy series. The story is written in third-person with three main point-of-view characters. The change in point-of-view always takes place with either the start of a new chapter or after a divider so it is never confusing. This book is very well-written with an intriguing plot and fascinating characters. I was pretty much hooked from the beginning. The plot is intricate and simple at the same time. I love the underlying mystery within the plot and the fact that even though everything is not as it seems the story itself is straight forward. Ana is in trouble and Jon decides to help her, thus a quest is born. Of course things aren't that easy for them, they have plenty of obstacles in their way but also some amazing allies willing to help. There is plenty of excitement and intrigue with just enough mystery to keep things interesting. The characters are well-developed, each with their own unique personality, flaws and all. It is incredibly easy to fall in love with all of them, not just Jon and Ana. In fact I adore Brandt.
